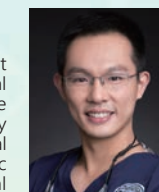

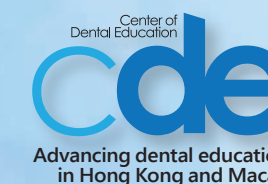
Dr. Ji Chao, Jack

Comprehensive treatment planning for removable partial dentures (by Dr. Leung)
Success in rehabilitation of patients with RPDs cannot be achieved with an appropriate treatment plan. Preparing the patients to receive RPD treatment as well as making good impressions so that useful models can be produced are important pre-requisites. Participants shall have a chance to learn and practise proper surveying skills.

Module 2: Designing Removable Partial Dentures

Lecture:

Designing removable partial dentures (by Dr. Lam)
Removable partial dentures treatments are bread and butter for many dentists. With an idea of what final prosthesis is, the clinician can prepare patient's mouth accordingly. This may include some form of fixed prostheses such as surveyed crowns and or overdenture attachments. This lecture will cover the basic knowledge and clinical decisions related to the removable partial denture design. Following the lecture, participants will have hands-on experience on survey design a wide range of real clinical cases.

Learning objectives:

- Understand the functions and interactions of different denture components
- Understand the clinical factors for determining support, retention and stability of RPD
- Appreciate the difficulties and management of free-end saddles and anterior saddles
- Understand the indication and planning of combining fixed restorations/prostheses with RPD including surveyed crowns and precision attachments

Module 3: Denture Fabrication and Delivery

Lecture:

Clinical stages of denture fabrication: from tooth preparation to delivery (by Dr. Pong)
Removable partial denture construction requires multiple clinical procedures. All the procedures should be planned and executed properly. Laboratory works are only proceeded accurately when correct clinical information is given. The lecture will focus on how to do self-assessment on tooth preparation, working impression, determination of vertical dimension and jaw position, occlusal planning and tooth selection as well as adjustment during RPD delivery. Good communication with the laboratory and assessment of laboratory works will also be addressed. During the hands-on session, the participants will have the opportunity to perform a variety of tooth preparations on a simulated clinical case for RPD including composite build-up to raise the survey line for retentive clasp.

Learning Objectives:

- Perform tooth preparations and make good working impression for RPD
- Determine vertical dimension and make correct jaw relationship
- Plan occlusion for RPD
- Select appropriate denture teeth
- Deliver and review RPD

Module 4: Managing Complications of Removable Partial Dentures

Lecture:

How to manage RPD complications: Adjust, Remake, Refund or Refer? (by Dr. Pow)
Despite recent advances in prosthodontics, removable partial denture (RPD) still plays an important role in daily dental practice and remains as a definitive or provisional treatment option for replacing missing teeth. However, complications in relation to RPD treatment are repeatedly encountered. In the lecture, clinical cases with various problems on RPD will be discussed. A step-by-step approach on how to manage such cases will also be presented. Following the lecture, participants will be invited to bring in their own clinical cases (at any stage) for small group discussion.

Learning objectives:

- Identify patients who have high risks of RPD complications
- Assess and identify common problems of RPD
- Prevent and manage various kinds of RPD complications

Hands-on:

Case discussion: participants are encouraged to bring their own cases for discussion, preferable with PowerPoint presentation, model, scan and/or planning. (by Dr. Pow and Dr. Lam)

Dr. Pow has developed many clinical techniques and published over 70 scientific/clinical articles and he won the Judson C. Hickey Scientific Writing Award of the Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry in 2015. He serves on the editorial board of the Clinical Oral Implants Research, International Journal of Prosthodontics, Journal of Prosthodontics and Journal of Investigative and Clinical Dentistry. Dr. Pow is now the President of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong and he was the President of Hong Kong Prosthetic Dentistry Society from 2014-2019.

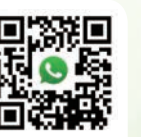
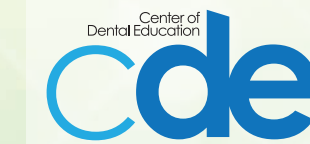
